Talking Walk-in Clinic Temporary Change of Venue

Please be advised that the Talking Walk-in clinic on 20th of May 2024 (usually at The Village CC) will be held at Folkestone Family Hub (Early years Building) on Dover Road as a one off.

This is to allow revamp of the Village Centre ready for its role as a Family Hub.

It will return to Village Family Hub from June on the third Monday of the month.

TAX Free Childcare

You can get up to £500 every 3 months (£2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare.

If you get Tax-Free Childcare, the government will pay £2 for every £8 you pay your childcare provider. This is paid via an online childcare account that you set up for your child.

You can get Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as 30 hours free childcare if you're eligible for both.

It's that time of the year where the hot weather will start to creep in, but we all know how the British weather can be. Please could children attend nursery with appropriate clothing and outdoor wear for the day, so that we may continue to engage in play outdoors. Such as sun hats or coats if it's windy or wet.

Parents' consultation with our new plans

Firstly, can we extend a very big thank you to all the parents for taking the time to feedback both their enthusiasm for the new setting but also the legitimate concerns they have going forward.

Some parents have asked us about where the new nursery is likely to be sited. At this present time we are exploring a number of sites, in consultation with various public and private bodies, it will definitely be situated within the boundaries of Folkestone town, but at present there is no final site confirmed.

We have also been asked about the fees. The construction of the new building will not be financed by increased fees to the parents. However as normal there may be an increase in fees in January taking into account inflation and meeting staffing needs.

To date Radnor Park Kindergarten have held meetings with our local MP, Damian Collins, leader Jim Martin and planning officers at Folkestone and Hythe District Council, a representative from Lord Radnor Estates based at Smith-Woolley Estate Agents and the local sufficiency officer employed by Kent County Council who is responsible for ensuring there are sufficient spaces for Early Years in East Kent.

All of the above representatives were very supportive of our plans but also confirmed that the Local Council has no Early Years strategy to meet the local Early Years needs and that this is a KCC responsibility.

These meetings have raised 5 possible sites for the location of the new setting and we have appointed a local architect to provide pre-application support for each location.

If anyone has any further questions or queries please do not hesitate to let us know and we will continue to keep you updated as and when we have anything confirmed.
